Guideline for the treatment of dry eyes (Ocular Lubricants)

New guidance has been produced in conjunction with Ophthalmologists at the Rotherham Foundation Trust and is available on the CCG website. The majority of preservative free products are in standard sized eye-drop bottles that contain a valve and filter that allow for a three month expiry from opening.

Script-switch has been uploaded with all current ocular lubricant products that can be changed to a formulary alternative and provide cost-savings. Members of the MMT will provide a QIPP program of changes that could potentially save over £50 K across Rotherham CCG. The main changes are for the bulky "Hylo" products and Unit Dose Vials.

We have emailed all Optometrists in Rotherham to advise them that: **GPs in Rotherham will no longer provide prescriptions for uncomplicated dry eyes**. The email also states that any patients they diagnose with simple dry eyes should be advised to purchase eye-drops as part of self-care, and given the Rotherham self-care prescription leaflet.

Oral Tuberculosis Agents Medicines Supply Notification update

Since August 2019 a number of oral TB agents have been impacted by supply issues, and this is likely to continue into the new year.

As Rifinah tablets are out of stock, clinicians are asked to prescribe the isoniazid and rifampicin separately.

NHS England & NHS Improvement have written out to community pharmacies with information on how to order oral TB agents directly from manufacturers should they have problems obtaining them from their usual wholesalers.

Omega-3 fatty acids part of NHS England items which should not be routinely prescribed.

A quick reminder to clinicians that Omega-3 fatty acid preparations are part of the 2017 NHS England items which should not be routinely prescribed.

NICE states that omega-3 fatty acid supplements should **not** be offered to:

- People who have had a heart attack more than 3 months ago, to reduce the risk of a further heart attack
- People with diabetes, kidney disease or at risk of heart disease
- Most people with high triglycerides (a fatty substance in the blood)
- Most people with a family history of high cholesterol
- People with liver disease
- Children and young people with autism to manage sleep problems
- People with multiple sclerosis.
